VICTORIAN PRINCIPALS' ASSOCIATION CONFERENCE

Gill Bartholomeusz and I attended the Principals' Association Conference last week and although it puts a lot of pressure on us all for both Gill and me to be out of the school, it was extremely worthwhile. The theme of the conference was around school culture, the importance of collaboration and how this supports improved student outcomes; the very essence of much of our recent teacher professional development and the parent information session held for our community recently. There was much confirmation regarding the work we are doing at CSPS and much learning to assist in our future directions, particularly given this is the year of our school's review. We were challenged to think about our current school practices and recent changes in that; what we have started doing differently and why, what we have kept doing over time and why that has continued and very importantly, what we have or should stop doing and why. We were inspired by the capabilities of information technology and its role in engaging students and motivating their learning and I was also reminded about the importance of teams and teamwork that is already

a strong feature of our CSPS school culture (students, teachers and parents), with a line that resonated, particularly in relation to our children; "Protect the tribe so the individual thrives". Much of what we learnt over the two days will serve us well in the work we are currently doing and the work in our school as we move forward, which is very powerful, as we all know, we have no control over the past, only over now and the future. Gill and I both returned feeling excited and optimistic about our work and the place we are in as a school and this made us feel extremely grateful about the jobs we are lucky enough to have.

Screen time


