

#### ENTERING AND EXITING THE SCHOOL

You may have noticed the new electric gate at the entry to the teachers' car park (near the pedestrian crossing) and also the new side gate near the front path to the main office. These have been erected for student safety. Please ensure the side gate is kept closed for the students' safety.

The basketball gate will be open as well as the back double gates for entry and exit from the school each morning and afternoon. Gates will be locked at 9.40am and reopened at 3.20pm. We ask parents to only enter through the main foyer for matters requiring the office to minimise congestion.

#### STUDENT SAFETY

I'd like to advise parents that duty of care is of paramount importance and the staff at CSPS are always learning from experiences and endeavouring to improve the safety of our environment, as well as school procedures. Most parents will be aware that we have regular evacuation and lockdown drills to ensure everyone becomes familiar with what needs to happen if a real emergency ever occurred. I would also like to remind everyone that students should not arrive at school prior to 8.45am (when there is a teacher on duty in the playground), unless they are attending Before School Care with Camp Australia or a supervised school activity. Similarly, all children should be in the care of a parent/carer if they are still at school after 3.45pm, when the teacher goes off duty. If children are unaccompanied by an adult outside the designated school supervision times, they will be taken into the Outside School Hours Care program to ensure their safety. This cost will be the responsibility of the parent. Thank you for your support in ensuring the safety of our children

## School Council Elections 2017

#### What is a school council and what does it do?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally formed bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within centrally provided guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

Who is on the school council?

There are three possible categories of membership:

- A mandated elected Parent category. More than one third of the total members must be from this category. Department of Education and Training (DET) employees can be Parent members at their child's school as long as they are not employed at the school.
- A mandated elected DET employee category. Members of this category may make up no more than one third of the total membership of school council. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.
- An optional Community member category. Its members are appointed by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experiences. DET employees are not eligible to be Community members.

The term of office for all members is two years. Half the members must retire each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

#### Why is Parent membership so important?

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school. Those parents who become active on a school council find their

involvement satisfying in itself and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

#### How can you become involved?

The most obvious way is to vote in the elections, which are held in Term 1 each year. However, ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant. In view of this, you might seriously consider

- standing for election as a member of the school council
- encouraging another person to stand for election.
- Do I need special experience to be on school council?

No. What you do need is an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

#### What do you need to do to stand for election?

The principal will issue a notice and call for nominations following the commencement of Term 1 each year. All school council elections must be completed by the end of March.

If you decide to stand for election, you can arrange for someone to nominate you as a candidate or you can nominate yourself in the Parent category.

DET employees whose child is enrolled in a school in which they are not employed are eligible to nominate as parents for the school council where their child is enrolled

Once the nomination form is completed, return it to the principal within the time stated on the notice of election. You will receive a Nomination Form Receipt in the mail following the receipt of your completed nomination.

If there are more nominations received than there are vacancies on council, a ballot will be conducted during the two weeks after the call for nominations has closed.

#### Remember

- Ask at the school for help if you would like to stand for election and are not sure what to do
- Consider standing for election to council this year
- Be sure to vote in the elections.

The app has some great features that will allow us to get information through easily and quickly, you'll be reminded about important calendar dates 24 hours before, and everything we post can be translated into one of 91 languages!

You will also be able to submit student absence via the app now, authorised by your signature, electronically signed straight onto the screen with your finger!



The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

#### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

#### The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- •• \$125 for primary school students
- •• \$225 for secondary school students.

## ARE YOU A GOOD COMMUNICATOR? ARE YOU A PEOPLE PERSON?

#### **CLASS REPRESENTATIVES NEEDED!**

Each year our school has a network of Class Representatives whose role in each class is to liaise between teachers and parents. Class Representatives organise class social activities, and support the school's communication between the home room teacher and the parents. This role can be shared by **up to two** parents per class, with one being the main contact for the teacher. The Class Representatives may be taken on by a mum, dad or a guardian.

As a Class Rep, your primary responsibilities may include (but are not limited to):

- Organising, distributing and obtaining consent for a class list with parent contact details and providing this list to parents in the class whose name is on the list, the office and to the teacher.
- Liaising between the teacher and the class parent body for assistance with class activities, excursions, reading program, concert costumes etc
- Liaising with the Class Rep co-ordinator to provide additional information to parents about upcoming events.
- Organising a morning tea/evening get together in Term 1 so that parents have the opportunity to get to know each other. Other functions throughout the year may be organised such as class picnics, parent dinners etc.
- Assisting parents who are new to the school to feel welcome, perhaps organising another parent as a buddy to ensure that new parents are provided with support when starting at the school (outside of the initial intake for prep)

NB: If a parent signs on to be a Class Rep, they will need to provide their email address and mobile phone number to the Class Rep Co-ordinator.

- If you are interested in taking on a Class Rep role please complete the 'Expression of Interest' form below. This form should be returned to your child's class teacher **by Monday 13th February.**
- The class teacher will then advise the parents who will be the Class Rep for the grade. Teachers will endeavour to ensure that we have a cross-section of parents involved in our school community.




