## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

### REPORTING TO PARENTS

For the past several weeks, our teachers have been focussed on writing student reports. These reports reflect achievement at a point in time for each student's learning, reflected incrementally along the learning continuum. The rate and pace of learning is not fixed or constant and there may be plateaus and even setbacks at times, as different children learn at different rates. Teachers make informed, on-balance judgements about a student's progress against the Vic Curriculum F-10 achievement standards, based on evidence gained from the range of formal and informal assessment tasks and learning experiences. When students, teachers and parents work together, as part of the reporting process, this strengthens the process for improving achievement in learning. The three-way conferences for students in Years 2 to 6 are a crucial part of this process. They help parents gain a meaningful understanding of their child's achievement. I encourage parents to read the information on three-way conferences in this newsletter, in preparation for the conferences. I am grateful for the significant personal time and effort that teachers put into ensuring comprehensive reports are provided to our parents and that they are available for parent/teacher interviews and three-way conferences at times that give parents some flexibility around their working hours. Parent partnerships in supporting student learning are valued by our teachers and we look forward to seeing parents at the interviews/conferences.

### PARENT QUERIES AT CSPS

From time to time parents may have queries or issues regarding their child at school. At Caulfield South we believe these are best addressed by students, parents, teachers, principal class and support staff, working together respectfully towards a positive outcome. It's our experience that issues are best addressed through the school rather than directly between the families of students involved. The first point of contact should be the class teacher. It is important that parents are clear about their concern and it is a good idea to have given some thought to how the problem may be solved, prior to contacting the school. In most cases, issues can be addressed successfully in this manner, particularly if they are followed up early. If there is not a satisfactory resolution, parents may need to contact the Year Level coordinator, who may in turn involve one of the school leadership team. There may be secondary consultation with other professionals such as the school psychologist or social worker, to assist in deciding on the best course of action. Teachers at Caulfield South are diligent and trained in following up incidents and concerns using a restorative practices approach, which has been well documented in previous newsletters, at our parent information sessions with Adam Voigt and in policies (see CSPS website). The most successful outcomes are likely to emerge when parents approach issues with an open mind and work in partnership with the school. I encourage parents to trust in the professional, objective judgement and actions of our teachers who have the wellbeing of all students at heart.

## 2017 Attitudes to School Survey

### WE WANT OUR STUDENTS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what your child thinks of our school. The Attitudes to School survey is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education and Training to assist schools in gaining an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Our school will use the survey results to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience.

The Department has updated the survey for 2017 to include important new measures that are known to influence student engagement and performance. Students from Year 4 to Year 6 at our school will participate in the survey. Your child will complete the survey online during school hours, using a purpose-built secure online survey tool. It is important to note that we are not in any way 'testing' your child. Your child has the right to withdraw from the survey at any point before, during, or after completion of the survey.

Your child will be provided with a unique login to complete the survey. The student login is an assigned identifier that may be used by the Department to combine data for research purposes only. Your child's privacy and the confidentiality of your child's survey responses will be protected at all times as no identifiable personal data is included in the survey response file.

The survey results will be reported back to the school in Term 3. The survey results will be communicated to parents through the annual reporting process. Survey results are used to introduce or review programs that support teaching and learning and student engagement and wellbeing.

This year the Attitudes to School survey will be conducted at our school over the period Wednesday 7 June to Friday 23 June. The survey only takes 20-30 minutes to complete and occurs during your child's class time.

## TYPES OF RESTORATIVE PROCESSES

**Restorative questions** are non-judgemental ways of prompting someone to consider the feelings of others, the impact of his/her actions, and what can be done to make things right. Restorative questions help the respondent learn for the incident and problem solve.

**Restorative Conversations** or 'chats' may be formal or informal, structured one-on-one discussions that use restorative questions, "I" statements, and empathetic listening to guide someone through reflection, problem solving, and repairing harm. Rather than chastising a harm-doer for his/her behaviour, Restorative Conversations help identify root causes and place responsibility on the harm-doer to understand the impact of his/her behaviour and take steps to make things better.

## RESILIENCE TIPS FOR PARENTS

**Keep things in perspective:** In trying times, try to consider the stressful situation in a broader context and keep a long-term perspective. Avoid blowing an issue out of proportion.

**Avoid seeing crises as insurmountable problems:** You can't stop highly stressful events, but you can change how you interpret and respond to these events. Try looking beyond the present to how future circumstances may be a little better. Note any subtle ways in which you might already feel somewhat better as you deal with difficult situations and seek the help of others with an open mind.

## Three-Way Conferences

On the 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> of June, students from Years 2 to 6 will be participating in three-way conferences.

Three-way conferences involve the teacher, parents and students. During the three-way conferences, everyone has a role to play. The students demonstrate their learning as they share their accomplishments and set new learning goals. The parents find out about their children's learning, have the opportunity to ask questions and express their ideas, and help make plans to support their children's learning at home. Teachers facilitate the three-way conversations. They support the learners and the parents by clarifying, elaborating and responding to specific questions and concerns.

The duration of the interview is 15 minutes. Students will begin by discussing their learning and then there will be the opportunity for the parents to ask questions and give encouragement.


Below are some sentence starters or questions that you can use to initiate discussion with your child about their learning experiences and future goals during the meeting:

- You really seemed to have been interested in this topic. Could you please explain what you meant by...?
- How has your thinking or understanding on this topic changed since beginning this task?
- I can see how your (use of language and punctuation) has improved.
- I noticed you used (a particular word or phrase). Could you tell me more about that?
- What makes you say that?
- How can you connect this to your everyday life?
- What PYP Attitudes have you displayed while working through this activity? I can see that you displayed confidence/cooperation/risk-taking/empathy/independence/commitment/tolerance/respect/integrity/confidence/enthusiasm/creativity when you completed this task. (Choose one!)
- You should be really proud of...
- What areas of this task did you find most challenging?
- I know that you have found ... challenging in the past. I can see that you have made extra effort in this area. Can you tell me about that?
- What would you do differently if you attempted it again?
- Perhaps next term you can focus more on ... for a goal.
- Thank you for sharing your learning with me/us, it's so good to have seen what you do at school

We believe that a three-way conference is one important way to support student learning. It provides a fantastic forum for students to reflect on their learning and set future goals.

We appreciate your participation in this process and look forward to meeting with you.







In semester 2 Melbourne Girls' College will be having 17 new students arrive to study for their VCE with us. They will start off studying intensive English at Glen Eira English Language Centre and then in 2018 they will transition to MGC.

We are currently looking for homestay families for the girls for the six months they will be studying at Glen Eira English Language Centre, which is a fantastic opportunity for families to have a short term trial of hosting an international student. The girls will become a part of your family for six months, just in the same way an exchange student would!

You will receive 7 day a week support in your journey as a new homestay family, with the services of a translator to be able to communicate with the students' families. You will be paid \$315/week to cover the cost of housing, feeding and laundering the new member of your family, and our international student program team will make regular contact with you to make sure you're all getting along.


