PRINCIPAL'S REPORT—Gayle Yardley HEADING INTO TERM 2

I hope there was much fun and relaxation during the holidays and, after almost two weeks into the term, I hope everyone is still feeling the effects of the recent break, with lots of energy for a really productive and happy term!

CLASS REPRESENTATIVES

Thank you to all those parents who have taken on the role of Class Rep for 2018. This role plays such a crucial part in bringing our community together to support one another, teachers, school activities and most importantly, our children, through being the communicators and organisers for a class. I am most grateful to them.

ANZAC DAY-DRUM CORPS

Our Drum Corps had a particularly large contingent this year, with 12 ex-students joining in the March to honour the ex-servicemen and women of Australia. This tells a story of commitment to the Corps and our school, along with gratitude towards our Drum Master Sandy Hood, who provides such a unique opportunity for our students. These children not only learn to be excellent and disciplined drummers, but they learn about the history of the Australian Services and the courage demonstrated, as well as the heartache and tragedy of war. Active April Ambassador Visit Paralympian Matt Haanappel

On Tuesday the 24th of April Paralympian Matt Haanappel came to our school to talk to Year 6 about his experiences in the Commonwealth Games, as an athlete in general, and how he overcame his disability. Matt has cerebral palsy that has affected the entire right side of his body. Matt told us that his disability also brought opportunities that some of us may never get in our lives. He explained to us that competitors are ranked 1-10, with 1 being the most severe disabilities. This ensures competitors face people with similar disabilities. Matt specialises in freestyle and backstroke, and currently holds the record for 25 metres freestyle and got a gold medal for the men's 4x100 metres freestyle relay. The team's time was 3.50.17.




