PRINCIPAL'S REPORT - Gayle Yardley

REPORTING TO PARENTS

Student reports will be sent home tomorrow. I encourage all parents to read these thoroughly and attend our Parent/Teacher meetings for students in Prep and Year 1 and 3-way conferences in Years 2 to 6, to gain further insight into student achievement. Research on parent involvement in a child's education says it has a positive effect on their success. Professor John Hattie has conducted extensive research into what works in schools to improve student learning outcomes. He says that long-term, consistent parent engagement adds greatly to children's overall achievement. The kind of involvement of parents that can have a significant positive impact includes setting goals together; displaying enthusiasm for learning; encouraging good study habits; asking questions; valuing experimentation and learning new things and enjoying reading. The 3-way conference is a wonderful forum for putting this involvement into practice and therefore, contributing to greater success for our children. Most issues affecting student learning are appropriate for raising in the conference, however, there are times when parents need to discuss issues with teachers, without children being present. In such circumstances, parents should make an appointment with the teacher to discuss the issue at the time it arises. In this way, we hopefully place everyone in a great position at this time of year, for setting new goals for the next steps in learning, including both social and academic goals.

Three-Way Conferences, June 2018

On the 25th and 26th of June, students from Years 2 to 6 will be participating in three-way conferences. Three-way conferences involve the teacher, parents and students.

During the three-way conferences, everyone has a role to play. The students demonstrate their learning as they share their accomplishments and set new learning goals. Parents find out about their children's learning and have the opportunity to ask questions and express their ideas, and help make plans to support their children's learning at home. Teachers facilitate the three-way conversations. They support the learners and the parents by clarifying, elaborating and responding to specific questions and concerns.

The duration of the interview is 15 minutes. Students will begin by discussing their learning and then there will be the opportunity for the parents to ask questions and give encouragement.

Below are some suggested questions that you could use to initiate discussion with your child about their learning experiences and future goals during the meeting:

- How has your thinking or understanding on this topic changed since beginning this task?
- I can see how your (ability to collaborate with others) has improved. Why do you think this has happened?
- I noticed you used (a particular word or phrase). Could you tell me more about that?
- What makes you say that?
- How can you connect this to your everyday life?
- What PYP Attitudes have you displayed while working through this activity? I can see that you displayed confidence/cooperation/risk-taking/empathy/independence/commitment/tolerance/respect/integrity/confidence/enthusiasm/creativity when you completed this task (choose one!).
- You should be really proud of...
- What areas of this task did you find most challenging?
- I know that you have found ... challenging in the past. I can see that you have made extra effort in this area. Can you tell me about that?
- What would you do differently if you attempted it again?
- Perhaps next term you can focus more on ... for a goal.
- Thank you for sharing your learning with me/us, it's so good to talk about what you do at school

We believe that a three-way conference is one important way to support student learning. It provides a fantastic forum for students to reflect on their learning and set future goals.

We appreciate your participation in this process and look forward to meeting with you.

Building parent-school partnerships

Reading your child's report

Reports can mean anxious times for children. Will my parents be disappointed or proud? This is the main concern of most children.

Could try harder ... always does her best ... lacks concentration ... easily distracted ... a pleasure to teach ... Do these comments, taken from a batch of student reports sound familiar? Student reports bring mixed feelings for parents. Pleasure and pride if they are performing well but considerable angst when children are not progressing as you hoped.

Reports can mean anxious times for children too. Will my parents be disappointed or proud? This is the main concern of most children. Kids of all ages take their cues from their parents, so your reaction to their school report can affect the way they see themselves as learners and as people.

Before you rip open the sealed envelope containing the report do a little self-check to see if you are in the right frame of mind:

1 Are your expectations for your son or daughter realistic and in line with their ability?

Expectations are tricky. If they are too high then kids can be turned off learning. Too low and there is nothing to strive for. Pitch your expectations in line with your child's abilities. A quick check of your child's last report cards may provide you with a good yardstick.

2 Do you believe that children learn at different rates?

There are slow bloomers, late developers and steady-as-you-go kids in every classroom, so

avoid comparing your child to siblings, your friends' children and even yourself when you were a child. Instead look for individual progress.

3 Are you willing to safeguard your child's self-esteem rather than deflate it?

Self-confidence is a pre-requisite for learning, so be prepared to be as positive and encouraging as possible.

School reports come in different formats. Some are prescriptive while some use grading systems such as A, B, C, etc. with room for teacher comments. Regardless of the format school reports should provide you with an idea of your child's progress in all subject areas, their attitude and social development.

Here are some ideas to consider when you open your child's report:

- **Focus on strengths.** Do you look for strengths or weaknesses first? The challenge is to focus on strengths even if they are not in the traditional 3Rs or core subjects.
- **Take into account your child's effort and attitude to learning.** If the report indicates that effort is below standard, then you have something to work on. If your child is putting in the required effort, then you cannot ask any more than that, regardless of the grading.

- **Broaden your focus away** from academic performance to form a picture of your child's progress as a member of a social setting. How your child gets along with his or her peers will influence his happiness and well-being, as well as give an indicator to his future. The skills of independence and co-operation are highly valued by employers so don't dismiss these as unimportant.
- **Take note of student self-assessment.** Kids are generally very honest and will give a realistic assessment of their progress. They are generally very perceptive so take note of their opinions.
- **Discuss the report with your son or daughter** talking about strengths first before looking at areas that need improvement. Ask for their opinion about how they performed and discuss their concerns.

After reports are read and discussed celebrate your child's efforts with a special activity or treat. In this way you will recognise progress and remind them that the holidays are just around the corner when they can forget about assessment, tests and reports for a while.




