## **CSPS PARENT PAYMENT ARRANGEMENTS FOR 2023**

Dear parent/guardian,

Caulfield South Primary School would like to advise you of our school's Voluntary Financial Contributions for 2023. Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary.

Caulfield South Primary School Council encourages all families to contribute towards improving our teaching and learning environment through Parent Payments of Voluntary Financial Contributions. Working together with you, and as a community, our school can achieve far better outcomes for our students than if the school works alone. The Voluntary Financial Contributions are a key part of ensuring that our students have access to the resources that will assist in achieving those better outcomes, and ensuring that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students.

Being a Government School, Caulfield South Primary receives funding from the Department of Education and Training which enables the provision of all basic education requirements, including the salaries of staff and other school operating costs. To supplement this, School Council asks our parents to maintain their strong commitment to supporting our children's educational outcomes, and the school financially, through the payment of three types of contributions: Curriculum Contributions, Other Contributions and Extra-Curricular Items and Activities.

- Requested *Curriculum Contributions* are for items that are directly used by students to improve their learning of the Victorian Curriculum, whether that be materials for science experiments and art, Apps for learning, or swimming lessons conducted by a local swimming school;
- Requested Other Contributions are for non-curriculum items and things that support our students learning, such as having a School First Aid Officer for health and safety, and a School Maintenance Person so students have a well kept environment for learning and play. Last year we began a School Council Community Projects contribution that was allocated to shade sails and shelter, and next year will be dedicated to other high impact projects for our children that the school community prioritise through school council consultation with the community; and
- Throughout the year, families are invited to purchase *Extra-curricular Items and Activities* to enhance student learning such as sporting activities, camps and in/excursions.

Historically, our students have been very fortunate that the school has usually experienced a high parent response to these requests, and it is imperative for our students that this continues. We have listened to the feedback given by the school community regarding parent payments, and are working to respond to the feedback:

- We understand that last year there was some confusion when parents attempted to make payment of the Voluntary Financial Contributions on the QKR! App, and the school will endeavour to improve the experience this year. The school will work to have all requested payments for a child shown on one page in QKR! to make it easier to understand the requested contributions, and to make payments for each child. We also encourage families to have the attached form handy as a reference when making payments via QKR! as the items are more clearly described in the form than in the app;
- We would like to clarify that as parent payments for Curriculum Contributions, and Other Contributions, are voluntary payments, parents can choose to either pay the requested amount for



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each type of contribution by ticking that selection, or may choose another amount to pay as nominated by them. If parents/carers choose to nominate amounts to pay, they need to fill in the boxes that are defaulted to show \$0.00 with their chosen contribution amount; and

• The school will ensure that parent contributions are spent on items that maximise educational outcomes for students, and that expenditure of money collected from parent contributions is in accordance with the Parent Payments Policy, and that the money collected is spent on items that provide good value for money.

We want to thank you for your continued support, whether that's through fundraising, volunteering your time, or making additional contributions. Over the years, your support has made a huge difference to the programs we can offer. Some of the differences the voluntary Other Contributions have made include:

- Grounds, buildings and playground equipment maintenance
- Cyclic maintenance of air conditioning units in student classrooms (and last year, the school office)
- Installation and maintenance of shade and shelter at the school
- Painting, renovation, and upgrades of classrooms
- Improved health and well-being outcomes facilitated by our First Aid Officer

In 2023 we are excited to invest in science and STEM materials and resources as the school will be introducing a specialist STEM subject taught by a new specialist teacher, as well as for the Little Learners Literacy program being implemented next year.
