### **Principal's Report – Rohan Cooper**

This week is 'Education Week' across all Victorian Government Schools, with the theme of, 'Active Learners: Move, Make, Motivate', which celebrates physical activity, hands-on learning and student voice in education. Our school has celebrated learning this week in a variety of ways and across this term, we have a range of important events and activities to share with you.

### **Victorian Budget 2023/2024 – Caulfield South PS and the School Upgrade Delivery Fund**

I received written confirmation yesterday from the Honourable Natalie Hutchins MP, Minister for Education and Minister for Women, that Caulfield South Primary School will share in the 'School Upgrade Delivery Fund'. In 2023, this will provide funding to begin planning and design work for the election commitment project announced last year of \$9m to build a new 'competition grade' gymnasium.

Minister Hutchins outlined that, "Planning is the critical first stage of every capital works project and commencing this process now allows you to plan the project ahead of funding for the construction phase being allocated in a future state budget."

This is an incredibly exciting announcement for our community and we will continue to keep you updated regarding the initial planning phase.

### **2024 Prep Information Session**

On Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> June, our school leadership team will present our 2024 Prep Information Session for prospective 2024 Prep families. This night will give an overview of teaching and learning practices in our

school, as well as pertinent information regarding the 2024 Prep enrolment process. It will be run in the Senior Learning Centre from 5:00pm until 6:00pm.

The Department of Education (DE) has aligned this process across all schools, with enrolment applications due at all schools by Friday 28<sup>th</sup> July. For further information regarding enrolment, please read the extended article later in this newsletter from Sarah Putz, our Enrolment Officer.

### **Education Week ‘Open Morning’**

As I walked through our learning spaces on Tuesday, I was so pleased to see a great turnout of families to our Education Week ‘Open Morning’ event. I observed everything from synthetic phonics lessons in the Prep Classrooms, to science experiments in Grade 3 and even a ukulele-playing performance from Grade 4! Thank you to our teachers and students for their preparations for the day and to our families for their attendance and participation.

### **Semester One Student Reports and Parent-Teacher Interviews**

Our teachers have begun the process of preparing student reports for semester one, reflecting on the achievements of each student and identifying their areas for future growth. The reporting process will be supported by an opportunity to meet with teachers via either a parent-teacher interview (Prep to Year 2) or three-way conference (Years 3 to 6) during the final week of this term. Our Assistant Principal, Georgia Despotellis, will expand on this further in her article this week, particularly noting how we will need to structure the timing of the interviews / conferences to comply with the time-in-lieu ramifications of the new Victorian Government Schools Agreement regarding teacher work outside of regular hours.

### **Term 3 Curriculum Day – Monday 10<sup>th</sup> July**

As we continue our focus on improving mathematics results across our school, we have secured Charles Lovitt to work with our teachers on planning and delivering a high-quality mathematics program. To service this opportunity, we will conduct a Curriculum Day (student-free) on Monday 10<sup>th</sup> July (the first day of Term 3). Charles Lovitt is a consultant and regular keynote and workshop presenter both in Australia and internationally and we are privileged to be working with him on this important school improvement project.

### **Victorian PYP Network Annual General Meeting**

Earlier this week I attended the Victorian PYP Network Annual General Meeting, where Principals and Heads of Schools and PYP Coordinators met to share program highlights, unpack the ‘program development process’ and discuss network strategies and initiatives. I was joined at this event by our PYP Coordinator, Luisa Scarmozzino.

### Wellbeing at CSPS

The Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships (RR&RR) Program at CSPS is well underway. This program aims to develop students' social, emotional, and positive relationship skills. It helps students understand and manage their emotions, feel and express empathy and deal with challenges and change. The program helps students establish and maintain positive relationships and create positive gender norms.

Our Respectful Relationships display board is regularly updated to reflect the wonderful work that is taking place in our classrooms. The Prep students' work, 'Drawing Emotions' is currently on display. They have been naming various emotions and discussing the kinds of experiences that may trigger them. Please ensure that you have a look when you are at the school next!

### Illness

With Winter around the corner, we have seen an increase in cold and flus over the last couple of weeks. Every attempt is made to arrange for a Casual Replacement Teacher to be employed and take over the class of a sick teacher. Due to a teacher shortage, unfortunately there are times when one will not be available. I will use any resources at the school level to cover sick teachers, but unfortunately there will be times when I will need to split classes and/or cancel specialist classes for the day.

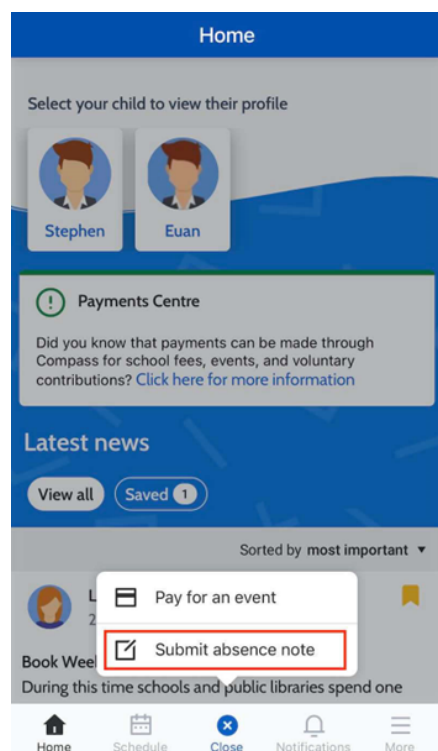
## Parent/Teacher Interviews for Prep-Year 2 and 3 Way Conferences for the Years 3-6

On the last week of Term 2, on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> June, Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> June (for Years 3-6 students only) and Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> June, we will be conducting Parent/Teacher interviews for all our Prep to Year 2 students and 3 Way Conferences for all our Year 3 to 6 students. With the new Agreement and its complexity to teacher work outside of regular hours, there is a limit of one spot for each student.

This is a great opportunity to hear about your child's progress at school and how we can work together to ensure that all our students thrive at school.

Bookings will be made through Compass Conferences. We will send out a Compass notification when they open.

## Compass – Recording Student Absences



As of the beginning of Week 7 (Monday 5<sup>th</sup> June) Flexi Schools will no longer be available for the recording of absences. The ordering of lunch orders, however, will continue via Flexi Schools until further notice.

Parents can add absence notes by clicking 'Shortcuts' and selecting 'Submit absence note'.

If you have more than one student at the school, you will be required to select which child the note is being added for.

In the note screen, the parent will need to select the reason from the available options listed.

You can then add any applicable details/comments and click on the 'Start Date' and/or 'End Date' fields to add in the correct information for the absence note.

When all content is added to the absence note, click the 'Add Attendance Note' button and the absence note will be added to your child's record.

This week the school received a letter from the Honourable Natalie Hutchins MP, the Minister for Education and Minister for Women, to formally advise that funding had been made available to begin planning and design work for the election commitment project announced last year of \$9 million to build a new competition grade gymnasium. The Minister also went on to say that further funding will be released in future budgets for construction. This letter was supported by a visit from Ryan Batchelor who is the Southern Metro representative in the upper house to launch the start of the planning of the project.

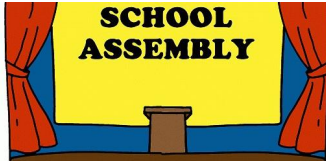

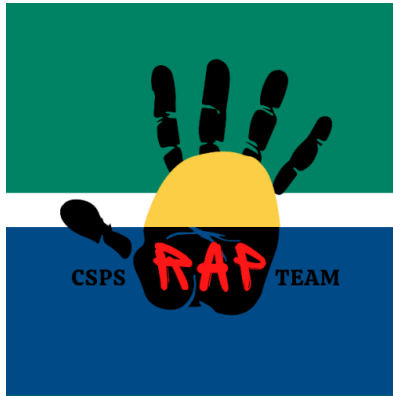

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## **Prep 2024 Prep Enrolments are now open**

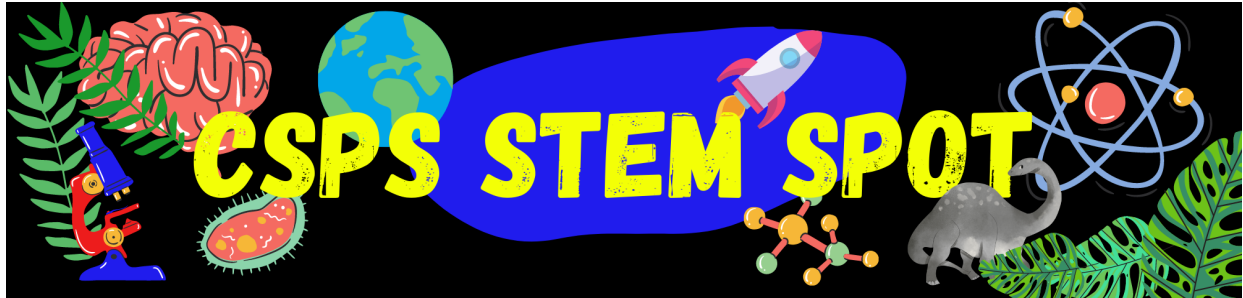
The Department of Education has released a new state-wide timeline for enrolling in Foundation (Prep) for the 2024 school year.

It is important to follow the state-wide timeline to enrol your child in Foundation. Enrolling your child in line with timelines allows us to plan our classroom, staffing and transition activities and ensures your child has the best start to school.

If you know of neighbours or friends who have a child starting school in 2024, please ask them to call the School to book a school tour or access an enrolment form from the office or our website.

## Term 2 STEM Update

Half way through Term 2 and the STEM program is well underway with students learning and exploring a variety of topics.

In Year 3, students are helping NASA with the Artemis Moon Mission. This week, they designed experiments to test the best material to keep astronauts safe from the dangerous UV radiation as these intrepid explorers head to the Moon in 2025. It's exciting to think that our students might be amongst the first humans to live on the Moon when NASA sets up the Artemis Moon base in 10 years time.



Year 4 students put their ironing skills to the test as they made beeswax wraps! Next week, they will compare their wraps to less environmentally friendly options.

Students in Year 5 and 6 are exploring electricity and light, so expect some bright and sparky outcomes as they learn how electricity works and why we can see things!

## WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING

Team Kids had a fun fortnight, learning cooking skills, about sciences and fun craft activities related to several celebrations such as World Mental Health Week, Mother's Day, National Family Week, Endangered Species Day and World Bee Day.

During before school care, our children have been actively engaged in the breakfast preparation making pancakes, scrambled eggs, burrito breakfast, smoothies, learning about several options of a good breakfast to start the day. Also, they have been curious wanting to make other kinds of food, giving suggestions such as hot chocolate for the cold weather, French toast, waffles (which have now been added to the menu). As a volunteer of the nappy collective, thank you for generous donations of the mother's day collective.

The is the only Australian nonprofit that focuses solely on collecting disposable nappies and distributing them to families in crisis.

We collect donations of new and leftover nappies - ones that little ones have grown out of or no longer need - and pass them onto our Community Partners that support families.

Through our research, we have learned that 1 in 10 families, or 280,000 children, don't have enough nappies - a situation we have named "nappy stress".
